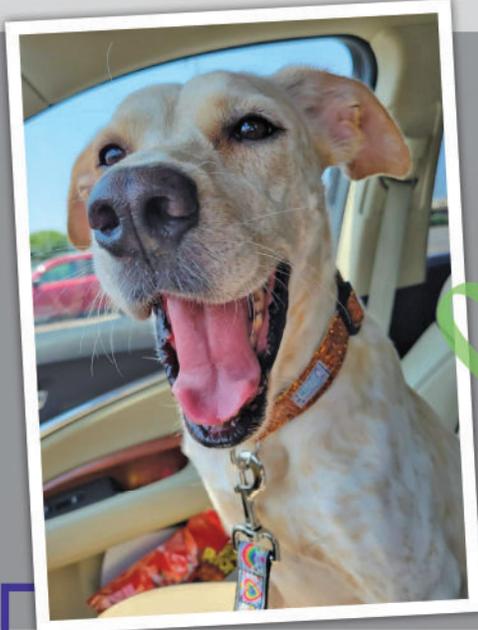

You Helped Save Iris' Life

Lovely Iris, a Lab mix, came to us in rough shape. When surrendered, she had delivered puppies six weeks earlier and had developed medical issues (extreme weight loss, joint issues, loss of bladder control, and very low energy). The Nebraska Humane Society (NHS) performed diagnostic tests and focused on helping her gain weight and strength. After stabilizing her, Iris went to foster care to recuperate in a home environment.

Iris responded to the care and put on weight and her energy levels improved. The NHS medical team found the medication needed to help her with bladder control. After nearly six months, she was fully recovered and ready for a new life. Her adopter fell in love with her and understands and accepts her medical issues. Iris has settled in at her new home.

We put Cash on a weight loss regimen that included walks on a leash. He also went on medication to help with his arthritic pain and anxiety. After working with him for a while, he found his forever home with an adopter who makes him smile every day.
